50 percent of all child deaths in Africa are caused by hunger

Child hunger costs African countries between **1.9 and 16.5% of their GDP**

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FOOD, NUTRITION, HEALTH & WELLBEING IN NIGERIA

An estimated 2 million children in Nigeria suffer from severe acute malnutrition

Malnutrition is a direct or underlying cause of 45% of all deaths of children under 5



7% of women of childbearing age also suffer from acute malnutrition

At the same time, child **obesity** is increasing and **33%** of Nigerian adults are obese or overweight

FOOD INSECURITY & AGRICULTURE



In Kenya, food consumption is

production

outpacing food

By 2030, Kenya's population is projected to rise by 15 million people – a roughly **30%**

Annual **agricultural production** needs to **increase by 75%** from 2015 levels in order to meet consumption in 2030

More than **60% people** of Kenya live below the poverty line

Around **3.4 million** Kenyans are severely **food insecure** while 309 000 have been internally displaced due to food insecurity and drought

Kenya will have to import more than 20% of the agricultural goods required to meet consumption by 2030

STATE OF THE **AGRICULTURAL** SECTOR IN KENYA

Agriculture contributes **26%** to Kenya's GDP annually, and another **25%** indirectly

Agriculture supplies **65%** of Kenya's total exports and provides more than **18%** of formal employment

Small-scale production is **75%** of the total agricultural output

-686= 100

These farmers produce more than **70% of** maize, 65% of coffee, 50% of tea, 80% of milk, 85% of fish, and **70% of beef** products

REASONS FOR LOW AGRICULTURAL OUTPUT IN KENYA

Low productivity in the agricultural sector

Rapid population growth

Only 2% of arable land is equipped for irrigation

Farmers struggle to gain access to finance, adequate seed, fertiliser and other inputs

Low uptake of new technology

FOOD, NUTRITION, HEALTH & WELLBEING IN KENYA

More than **42% of people** in Kenya live below the poverty line Source: UNICEF

Malnutrition is the single greatest contributor to child mortality at 53% Source: WHO

Kenya faces a **double burden of malnutrition** - undernutrition and overweight, obesity and diet-related non-communicable diseases



1 in 4 Kenyan children are malnourished Source: Save the Children

A further **2 in 5 Kenyan** children in rural areas are stunted Source: Save the Children

26% of Kenyan people aged 15-49 are **overweight**, with **7% classified as obese** Source: Emergency Nutrition Network



FOOD INSECURITY & AGRICULTURE MIDDLE EAST & NORTH AFRICA (MENA)

- By 2050 the Middle East and Africa will be home to **3.4 billion people**
- This population growth combined with climate change and geopolitical tensions has resulted in a high level of **dependence on agricultural imports**
- The region imports 40% of its food requirements source: INRA
- Unsustainable farming practices are widespread
- Undernutrition, malnutrition, and obesity coexist in the region
 - Two-thirds of arable land in MENA is planted with water-thirsty cereals that result in a limited diet

33 million

The number of malnourished children under 5 in MENA was expected to fall from 3 million to 1 million between 2000 and 2050. Instead, **due to** climate change, 2 million malnourished children could remain by 2050 Source: WFP

In those hardest hit by crises — Syria, Yemen, Iraq, Libya and Sudan — an average of **more than a quarter** of the population is **undernourished** *Source: WFP*
